2. That no payments are being requested for a digital learning program through Mpesa till number 4970488.
3. That ALL official communications for KeMU are shared through verified University channels and platforms.
4. That students are advised not to make any payment to the Mpesa till number as indicated in the fraudulent message attached.
5. That the message attached is **FAKE** and therefore null and void.
6. We urge you to stay vigilant and verify all communications through official KeMU channels.
